HOW IT WORKS

The Millet Museum is hosting scheduled school tours, based on age and curriculum levels. Each tour will include three rotating stations throughout the museum where students will engage with the history and culture of Millet. Guided by our staff, students will learn through interactive activities.

Tour Length: 2-2.5hrs

Tour Cost: \$5 per child

Kindergarten

- What is the past?
- What are some meaningful community places in Millet?
- How did people in the past meet their physical needs?
- How did community leaders practice cooperation in Millet?

Grade 1

- How did the railroad (a constructed landmark) shape Millet?
- Where did people move to Millet from & what traditions did they bring?
- How did people exchange goods and services in the past?
- How have national symbols changed?

Grade 2

- What prairie features are visible around Millet & what prairie natural resources are present in Millet?
- Learn how Museum staff measure & catalogue objects.
- Participate in planting a garden and discuss native vs invasive plants.

Grade 3

- How was Millet named & settled?
- How did natural resources shape the settling of Millet?
- How did Millet's settlers use simple machines?
- How do soil types and the water cycle impact growing plants?

Grade 4

- How did the Fur Trade impact the settling of Millet?
- Why did settlers come to Millet? Where did they come from & what traditions did they bring with them?
- What are some local food & water sources?

Grade 5

- How can information about the past be conveyed through artifacts, timelines, & images (primary sources)?
- How can interpretations of history be different?
- What effects can climate have on agriculture & food sources?

Grade 6

- How did Millet's municipal government form? How does it work?
- How can students engage in civic participation?
- What are some of Millet's native plants? What can they be used for?
