

Millet Centennial Heritage Garden

The Reason

Millet in Bloom, Millet and District Historical Society and the Town of Millet partnered to install and maintain an Alberta Centennial Heritage Garden to commemorate Alberta's Centennial in 2005. The garden is a lasting legacy in celebration of our centennial. Only heritage and native Alberta plants will be grown in the garden.

The Project

The three year project included project planning, design, site preparation, signage, kiosk (housing catalogue book and plot plan), plant research. Plant material donated by local residents. An important part of the project is a published compilation of the histories of these plants written by the donors.

Funding

Through a grant, Millet in Bloom budget, the Town of Millet, County of Wetaskiwin and in-kind support.

Installation and Maintenance

Public Works staff and Millet in Bloom volunteers prepared the site and installed the hardscape. Millet in Bloom volunteers maintain the garden.

Ribbon Cutting and Planting Day

Sunday, May 27, 2007 with program, media and refreshments. Plant donators wrote the story of the plant and who the plant was in memory of. Volunteers assisted in all these areas.

Donations

Plants may still be added to the garden. If you wish to plant a heritage or native plant in memory of a loved one there is a form to be completed prior to selection and planting. The forms are available at the Town Administration Office.

Donations to the maintenance of the gardens are accepted through the Town Administration Office as well.
